 - Elevate & SMILE: Enough staff for 60-75 based on MOY iReady and RI assessment
 - Concern: D buses don't run in summer; reaching out to WMATA
 - LEAD: Language Enrichment program
 - For students with C or lower in Spanish to fill in gaps in knowledge rather than repeating a course.

 - LEAD is 2 (teacher avail)
 - SMAC is 4
 - RISE 3
 - SMILE 3 wk (teacher avail)
 - ELAVATE 3 wk (teacher avail)
 - Generally driven by availability of teachers; would love to have more
 - Why is it fair to resource acceleration program (SMAC) longer than catch-up programs?
 - Demand for programs is an issue; Donaldson expects high demand for LEAD. Also consider focusing on high school credit class success (summer between 6-7 and 7-8 grades)
 - Principal Neal will work with teachers on interest / availability and capacity to run with other programs
 - Rottman: 3 weeks is an ideal duration for ELAVATE teaches the curriculum desired, balances teacher availability, student demand (consider time off, camps)



D. SIT update

 - Implementation will also be difficult
