Meeting called to order at 7:32am

- I. Welcome and introductions
- II. Principal's Report (Principal Neal)
- Start of the school year updates
 - Teachers
 - o Down a music teacher due to late resignation
 - Science teacher (7th) hasn't returned; currently filled by long term sub
 - Math teacher making way through HR process
 - Other than that, teachers in every classroom
 - Q (Dannenberg): for Chinese, why is there a 30 student class? A: Co-teaching currently but going to make some changes soon to balance them
 - Q (Dannenberg): have you looked at the research on having on big co-taught class vs. two smaller classes? A: classes are being rebalanced.
 - Q (Dannenberg) what is the target size? A: what we can do.
 - Structure for 1500, but currently at 1400 so not many classes over 25 students
 - Partnering with Relay for teacher professional development
 - Starting BOY testing 9/11
 - Approaches for identifying students for ELA enrichment will use PARCC and iReady

- Q (Stuart) about math strategies being implemented? A (Neal): with additional budgeting, 3 full coaches to support teachers with instruction. Also, switched math planning from grade-level to content-level. Have funds to support a fall iReady sprint based on BOY scores. Multi-lingual learners will get high impact tutoring through FEV (2x 45-min sessions per week).
- Reading (Ms. Baer): Partnering with DCPS central for tutoring on reading supports for students 2+ below grade level
- 6th grade family workshop (virtual) to extend orientation
- 9/13 in person open house back to school night (no students unless stay with families)
- Q (Dannenberg) when do parents get PARCC scores? A (Neal) when Deal gets paper copies they will then send them out; usually about a 3-week lag, also need to get incoming 6th grader from their elementary
- Q (Dannenberg) request for data from summer SMAC & SMILE math programsto report out on impact of funds raised A: will do at next LSAT meeting; success rate for SMILE will be based on BOY data

- PARCC results

- Nice progress and overall good trends in scores, with increasing % of kids scoring 4's and 5's
- Some kids still needing additional supports, especially certain subgroups
- Plan to present some of this (high level) at October ADCA meeting.
- Lunchtime non-teacher staffing challenges [from Mr. Donaldson]
 - Historically, group of non-teachers with kids at lunch for safety (APs, Deans, counselors, social workers, social justice coordinators)
 - DCPS initiative called "Becoming" for social-emotional development at arrival (?) and lunch
 - Counselors and social workers will no longer be in that space due to contract requirements
 - Hard to backfill because not a lot of non-instructional staff in the school
 - Call for volunteers for lunch (with admin premium) to cover lunch
 - Requested additional security
 - Not likely to get additional support from DCPS
 - Down 2 adults
 - This is likely a Deal-only problem given the structure of a large school and with relatively few non-instructional staff
 - One option: using a mentor program (DCPS cleared, Deal trained) any takers to find volunteers to do that? Looking for consistency and ability to handle 500 middle school kids

- Technology policies, Yondr bags

- Message re: "you can't have your phone on you" even
- Q (Dannenberg): are Yondr bags a Deal initiative or DCPS? A (Neal): DCPS requires personal technology not be available to students during the day but doesn't specify

school implementation; some schools use staff members, Banneker uses an app, three other DCPS schools use a locker system. Those alternatives tend to take a lot of staff and student time and are of varying effectiveness.

III. Comprehensive School Plan

- DCPS feedback
 - Instructional superintendent meeting next Friday; no big changes to discuss today
 - (Stuart): request to share any changes to CSP so that LSAT can see any prior to CSP deadline for submission
 - (Dannenberg): How should we send feedback on CSP?
 - Q on Relay / PD any teacher evaluation of Relay?
 - A (Neal) Relay has a survey, will check if they can share that info with us
 - o (Dannenberg): what is the participation rate on Saturday ZAP in the past?
 - A (Neal) prior to pandemic ~15-20 students; mainly 7th / 8th graders, sometimes just kids who wanted to hang out. Very different for kids who are over-scheduled vs. under-scheduled; data on rates not available
 - Q on community project listed as just "focus students" shouldn't that be "all students"?
 - A (Neal): we want all students to do it, but well-supported students don't have a problem getting through it; the focus students need additional support. Will consider changes to language in CSP to clarify that it is still expected for all students, but with additional focus given to "focus" students to help them complete it.
 - (Dannenberg) Kudos on PARCC score growth, but how do goals in CSP match with new higher scores? For example, should we stretch goals higher where we're already meeting them based on recent PARCC data?
 - A (Neal): will retarget based on discussion with instructional superintendent
- Supports for off-team teachers [from Mr. Donaldson]
 - Issue is that off-team teachers don't get support (aides, parent meetings, information) to support off-team teachers helping meet the goals. Need to include off-team teachers in the strategies if they are going to be held accountable.
 - Ms. Neal: will work with APs if there are holes; only 3 students with dedicated aides
 - Teachers (especially off-team teachers) don't know what's going on if aides stop showing up they don't know if that's because they aren't needed any more or because they should be there but aren't.
 - Problem with 504s not getting to where they need to go Ms. Neal will address; should have all been sent out on Wednesday
 - Request for teachers to speak up ASAP with issues like this.
- Other comments/Finalizing
 - Discussion of PARCC scores / OSSE numbers

- Questions on Blue ribbon nomination? Deal would be eligible next for recognition next year, based on growth from last year to this coming year's scores
- April York raised idea of Deal also looking into green ribbon schools for environment, sustainability
